1. Call to Order

4. Financial Report

Curt Brees reviewed the Financial Report with year to date expenses through 12-31-14. Expenses year to date are \$30,345.36 and the Sno-King fund balance, as of 12-31-14, is \$16,063.26.

 Tom Harman made a motion approving the fourth quarter financial statement. Tom Rainville seconded the motion.
The motion was unanimously approved.

5. Legislative Activity Report

Steve Lindstrom reported on the following legislative topics:

- Public Works Assistance Account (PWAA).
- House Bill 1079, which allows for joint utilization of engineering and architectural service contracts
- Senate Bill 5048 whereby, if a city passes a bill or ordinance to assume a district or portion thereof, it is subject to a referendum. Lindstrom stressed the senate bill could have a statewide effect. Washington Association of Sewer and Water Districts is proposing the right for a city to impose a utility tax in exchange for the right to vote by rate-payers on any proposed assumption. WASWD is trying to come to an understanding with AWC.

- The handling of rural water. Department of Ecology has a workgroup regarding "Water availability determinations". Lindstrom cautioned to be careful it doesn't impinge unincorporated areas which are part of district service areas.
- Rules of the Department of Health regarding geothermal and heat source wells. Both are being examined to be sure they are not adversely affecting water quality. There was a push to exempt geothermal wells from the permitting process.
- There are continued struggles in Skagit County, (moratorium) regarding the drilling of what were permit exempt wells for rural residential developments. Decisions there could end up impacting water resource decisions state-wide.

6. Other Business

The Coalition discussed public relations.
