## 5. Review & Approve Minutes

## 7. Legislative Activity Report ~ Steve Lindstrom

Legislative Update

Mr. Lindstrom discussed six key issues:

- Support long-term protection of water sources including potable surface and wellfield water, from pollution by storm water or reclaimed water. There is little likelihood that any further action on this issue will take place at this time.
- 2. The recent WASWD work session before the Senate Committee supporting the opposition to impose any charge or fee for the use of public-right-of-way or unreasonable utility fees or taxes.

Court actions continues, WAWD will initiate some legal briefs regarding the appeal of the Supreme Court's decision to remand the issue of franchise fees back to Superior court.

- 3. The work supporting legislative funding of the Public Works Assistance Account. This issue appears closed for the session.
- 4. Monitoring the DOE's establishment of nutrient discharge limits. Second substitute Senate Bill 6342 passed the Senate, but died in the House Committee on Appropriations.
- 5. Supporting rules and/or legislation that ensures the distribution and use of reclaimed water within a district's service area requires mutually agreed upon agreement between the district and entity providing any amount of reclaimed water for use. No further apparent action on this issue.
- 6. Promote efforts to reduce flushing of produces not designed to break apart in sewer systems. HB 2565 is eligible for final action on the Senate floor, after passing the House.

Other Items currently monitoring:

- SB 5024 oppose added complexity to billing processes; no longer object due to changes in the language of the bill.
- SB 6420 HB 2694 "Dig Law" passed the house vote and moved to the Senate.
- Steve gave a brief update on HB 2265, 2529, 2588 and 2629 and will continue to monitor.
